The riding arena at Kemmerer opens its giant barn doors to children year round. Horses have been making a difference here for over a century, and we keep finding new ways!

There have been so many heroes who have made equine therapy possible at Kemmerer Village, including the United Way, and our many church partners. The Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks have given over \$30,000 in grants helping bring the healing power of our herd to community children with disabilities. This fall, an average of 23 children (who do not live at KV) ride weekly. Together we are able to give children with a broad range of disabilities equestrian therapy building core strength, coordination and confidence.

The popularity and support of this program are helping us reach even more kids. Our surveys consistently show the benefits we are providing and the need for more access to Equine Therapy at Kemmerer Village. In September, our Board of Directors approved the hiring of a part-time riding instructor to increase these services. Supporting Kemmerer Village allows us to offer incredible services like equine therapy.

On a daily basis, she is pleased to lead a team of support specialists. Her work days are spent organizing schedules for her team, keeping foster parent licenses on track, renewing/closing foster parent licenses, communicating directly

with DCFS, conducting home studies when needed, and many other fine details for licensing.

When she's not working or studying for her Master's in Communication and leadership, her favorite way to spend days off is with her family, close friends, or painting. Nicole has always had a passion for adoption and the foster care system. She and her husband, Brad, knew in their hearts they were meant to adopt. They started the adoption process, through a private adoption lawyer, in March 2008. After meeting many birth mothers, Nicole and Brad were picked in January 2009 to adopt a newborn baby girl due in June 2009. Nicole and the birth mother formed an unbreakable connection, and their lives are still very much intertwined to this day. Their bond is so tight that the birth mother allowed Nicole in the delivery room, and allowed Nicole to hold her daughter first. Although an open adoption is not for everyone, Nicole, Brad, their daughter, and the birth mother could not imagine the life journey being any other way.

Kemmerer kids played BLIND volleyball during Therapeutic Recreation. This may sound odd, but a tarp was placed over the net. The teams could not see who was serving, or where the ball was coming from. The unusual experience was challenging and kept everyone on their toes. Once the game was over, the children discussed how in the game and in life we can't always see what is going to happen next, or what curve ball life might throw at us. These discussions of expectations, attitudes, and efforts will stick with these young people.



Did you know, Kemmerer Village on-campus schooling officially began in 1983? Kemmerer Village Campus School Facts:

- The average class sizes are 4-6 students.
- Staffing consists of a Principal, 3 teachers, each with a classroom aide, 2 crisis intervention specialists, and 1 administrative secretary.
- Students are highly motivated through positive reinforcements such as special movie outings and the school store which is filled with soft blankets, snacks, books, art kits, and games.
- Staff promote good study habits by providing structure, caring, and consistency. These supports have often been missing in our students' educational experiences.
